<u>Dressage</u>

Tests include:

- USDF/USEF Intro to 4th Level
- USEA Starter to Advanced
 - Please make sure they understand and practice any dressage tests they select.
- Musical Test Training to 4th Level
 - Successful musical freestyles involve significant preparation. If selecting
 - a freestyle or a pas de deux, start practicing early.
- Dressage Champs Qualifier
 - Refer to USPC Dressage Newsletter & Rulebook
 - Select the tests to qualify for your level
 - NOTE: Standard qualifiers must complete a musical test



MUSIC will need to be added to a "DROPBOX" Amy Fidler will email all musical freestyle participants to confirm their music



Western Dressage

Tests include:

- WDAA Intro, Basic, Level 1 to 5
- Musical Freestyle WDAA Intro, Basic, Level 1 to 5

Show Jumping

Lower level - Height 0.70m and lower :

- Round 3 Blue Ribbon Round

Intermediate & Advanced level - Height 0.75m and higher :


- Round 1 -Knockdown with an Equitation
- Round 2 -Knockdown with Qualifying Jump-Off
- Round 3 -Two Phase

Horse Management Instruction Program

"The Horse Management Program in a USPC club or center must stress and teach safety first, above all else. The health of USPC members and their horses or ponies is of primary importance. To this end, the program for all levels must stress preventive techniques, common sense, and daily routines within a reasonable framework of expectations. USPC members must recognize that all horse sports require effective care of the horse. The instruction program should, therefore, be incorporated into all USPC activities." Hard Work and Determination



Pony Club teaches that nothing can be achieved without hard work and determination. It doesn't matter what horse you own or how much money you have. What matters is your drive, your determination, and your work ethic.

TIP: It is more efficient if **EVERY TEAM MEMBER** has their own cleaning equipment. You only need a team set but, keep in mind, they are ALL trying to use the same equipment at the same time..... morning chores and stripping stalls are key times for everyone to need these tools

Sign Up on Wufoo

Please be prepared to enter and upload all required forms and information at time of entry. Unfortunately Wufoo DOES NOT save work so you will want to enter at one sitting. We recommend that you have each of your competitors fill out the rally worksheet and have that in front of you while completing this entry form.

- Rally Worksheet is included in the packet
- Rally cost is \$180 for a mounted competitor, \$25 for a stable manager
- You will **pay all fees** once you submit the entry.
- Pay via credit card, debit or PayPal.

Documents needed at the time of sign up:

- Coggins for each horse
- Proof of Flu vaccination
- Coaching form (required for all Show Jumping)
- Chaperone form (1 form per team)

CLOSING DATE Friday, 5/24/24

- Consent to Rally with Senior members (complete for every member under the age of 18 if a senior member is on the team)
- Emergency Contact Form (complete for members over the age of 18)
- Wyn Farm Liability Form (complete for each participating member)
