CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFIERS:

If you sent in your championship intention form, assume you are going to qualify. The RS will meet with parents at the end of the rally while you are packing up. **Anyone attempting to qualify for Championships must be aware of eligibility requirements**.

Reminder, <u>GLR Championship intention form</u> are due May 1st (postmarked, or digitally submitted). All championships applications and payments are due to USPC on Monday, June 24th.

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General Rally Information

Eligibility	All Pony Club members in good standing may participate. Club, GLR and national dues paid in full.
o ,	• The DC is responsible for determining eligibility, class level and safety of members in their club.
Teams	TEAM CONFIGURATION
	 Consists of 3 or 4 riding members and a Stable Manager (Stable Manager optional but strongly recommended).
	Mixed rating teams are recommended.
	• If a team includes youth members and at least one member over age of 18, the parent/guardian of each youth
	member must sign a waiver, acknowledging that they are allowing their youth to be on the same team with an adult
	member. The waiver will be available during Wufoo registration and is included in this packet.
	Each team must have a captain.
	TEAM CAPTAINS
	• The team captain is an important role. This person should be contacting the other team members to ensure rally kits,
	stall cards, feed charts, are prepared and delegated/organized for their team.
	• The team captain also helps keep the team on schedule during the day of the rally and acts as a go-to person to help
	their teammates.
	• Team captains should do their best to stay positive and keep it fun for their team.
	• If your team does not designate a captain, the rally organizer will assign this role to the oldest member with the
	highest HM certification.
	STABLE MANAGER
	A stable manager is highly encouraged for your team.
	A stable manager is an unmounted member of the team.
	OTHER PEOPLE ASSOCIATED WITH YOUR TEAM
	• Each team must have an official adult chaperone. Members over the age of 18, must complete emergency contact info.
	• Dressage teams may have a coach. A coach is not required for Dressage.
	• Show Jumping teams DO require a coach. Teams may share coaches. A coach's form must be signed and on file.
	• Any coaching fees are negotiated directly between the rider and the coach and are the responsibility of the members.
	SCRAMBLE TEAMS
	• If your club does not have enough participants to form a full team, please sign-up members individually and enter the
	Team name as "SCRAMBLE-CLUB NAME". For example, SCRAMBLE-Pierport.
	• You can also put as your team name "SCRAMBLE-with other member name" if you have a friend that you would like to
	participate with.
	The rally organizer will put together scramble teams.
	 A team of 3 riders may be assigned an individual scramble member.
	It is possible that a team without a stable manager will be assigned one.
Mounts	• All mounts (mares and geldings only) must be 5 years of age or older at the time of the rally and should be the rider's
	regular mount for Pony Club activities and/or approved by the club DC or supervisor of instruction.
	• Mounts must be able to be stalled for a full day and be appropriate for member to manage on the ground mounted.
	Mounts may be shared by 2 competitors.
	ALL Mounts must have a current Coggins AND up to date Flu vaccination
Entries	All Entries need to be submitted electronically via Wufoo. Closing date is Friday, May 24, 2024

Rules	Horse Management for the rally will be run in accordance with the <u>2024 USPC Horse Management Handbook</u> , any
	addenda and the annual newsletter.
	• The Rally will be run in accordance with the <u>2024 USPC Dressage and Show Jumping Discipline Rulebooks</u> , all addenda
	and the current newsletter.
Stabling	• Entry fee includes stabling on the grounds starting the evening before the rally begins. Bring your own bedding. Stalls
	have a dirt floor.
	• Stall cards must be posted before leaving horses for the night if checking in the evening before official rally start.
	HM Note: Make sure stall cards are clearly readable. Cards should follow the basic format of the HM Rulebook.
	It's OK to be creative, just remember the main purpose is to find information <i>quickly</i> in case of emergency.
	 Stalls must be inspected before leaving or risk being assessed a cleaning fee. Dalla Comprises and UNA will ensuid a fixed information of atalla
	Rally Organizer and HM will provide final info about stripping of stalls.
	Be prepared to use trailers for tack. After all entries are received, clubs will be made aware if tack stalls are available.

	filled from a waiting list, full refund less \$25 non-refundable office fee.
Meals	• Meals are not included in the entry fee. Chaperones are encouraged to pack coolers for team tack rooms.
Farrier/Vet	• Will be on call during the rally. All services are to be paid for at the time of service; payment is the horse owner's
-	responsibility. Phone numbers will be available in the rally office.
Volunteers	• Each team containing junior competitors must provide a chaperone. Each team must also provide 3 additional
	volunteers. Horse knowledge is not required to volunteer. Assistant Horse Management Judges (AHMJs) with training
	are appreciated.
	• Volunteers may also be minors. Typically, most over the age of 12 can be helpful. Use good judgement when
	volunteering younger people as they need to function independently and in a timely manner. Please note that the
	person is a minor on the entry.

Wyn Farm Facility Rules

- Dogs MUST be leashed. Clean up after your own pet. No pets may be near the arenas or horses for the safety of the riders.
- No horse turnout available. Warm up and longeing in designated areas only. Longeing will be held according to USPC HM handbook. Members must sign up in HM office if they wish to longe or have their horse longed by a coach/parent/other knowledgeable individual. All longeing must be approved by the Chief.
- No one is allowed in the WYN Farm facility barn area. All participants, coaches, parents, and volunteers must NOT enter the facility barn where personal horses are kept.
- Clean all manure off gravel areas.
- Hand grazing permitted away from barns.
- Speed limit as posted by Wyn Farm. Please be respectful and drive slowly in and out of the facility
- Parking in designated areas only- past the barn being used for Rally

- Ensure that **all** members of the team are aware of the schedule, order of go, and plan for the following day.

- All riders should bring helmets to the initial briefing for inspection.
- All music must be provided either via <u>dropbox</u> or USB drive. Files must be uploaded to the online dropbox by Friday at noon, and USB drives delivered to the rally office upon check in. Music will be tested Friday evening for sound check. It is strongly recommended to have an additional digital back up of your music. - Turnbacks for each rider/horse should occur within one hour of the final ride of the day.

NO PARENTS ALLOWED IN THE BARN EXCEPT WHEN HELPING TO UNLOAD, LOAD OR DURING ESCORTED TOUR.

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Dressage Tests

Each rider will be given the opportunity to ride 2 dressage tests. Riders may choose to ride 2023 <u>USEF/USDF</u> intro – fourth level tests, 2022 USEA tests or 2022 western dressage tests. Competitors are encouraged to ride the tests that best suit their mount and goals. **Competitors attempting to qualify for championships must ensure they are riding the appropriate tests based**

on the qualification requirements for their division. These can be found in the 2024 USPC Dressage Handbook and 2024 USPC Dressage Newsletter. If you have questions regarding championship qualification, please discuss them with your DC or the rally organizing committee prior to the closing date.

Musical rides will be allowed as a third ride, but will not be included in team scores for rally scoring. You will receive completed score sheets from judges. Those competitors not choosing to qualify for standard championships or modified championships MAY ride a musical ride. **Standard championships qualifiers must ride a musical.** The schedule may prevent non-qualifying riders from performing their musical. If this occurs, entries will be prioritized by championships qualifiers, then entry date until time slots are filled.

- **Traveling Silver Plate: to highest placing team
- **"Golden Shovel": to team scoring least Horse Management points
- **Amber Bryan Trophy: to individual exhibiting best sportsmanship (awarded by CHMJ)

** Please indicate on your team entry form if you have these trophies and bring them along to be dropped off at the rally office upon arrival or arrange for delivery to the rally organizer in advance. Also, be sure to add your team's name to the trophy before bringing it back.

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Show Jumping Divisions

Riders are encouraged to enter level to best suit mount, experience and goals. All riders may enter Championship Qualifying divisions with DC and coach's approval, whether or not they have submitted a champs application form.

Lower Levels (0.70m and lower): Each rider entered in schooling divisions (ground poles, cross rails, Intro Jumper, and Beginner Jumper) will be given the opportunity to jump 3 rounds with courses created to meet the requirements of the class entered. Rounds will be Normal Knockdown with Equitation score, Knockdown with Qualifying Jump-Off, and Blue Ribbon Round.

Intermediate and Advanced Level (0.80m and higher): Those competitors entered in Intermediate or higher divisions will ride 3 rounds. These rounds will occur in the following order: Knockdown with an Equitation (Round (1), Knockdown with Qualifying Jump-Off (2), and Two Phase (Round 3).

* The first 2 rounds will apply to team scores for rally scoring. Other rounds will be recorded for champs qualification purposes.

Anyone qualifying for Championships must ride in either a Modified or Standard class in the list below. You must have already sent your Championship Intention form to the region. Others may ride in these divisions with permission from their DC. All championships applications and payments are due to USPC on Monday, June 24th.

- HM and Overall Ribbons to all competitors (including stable managers)
- "Little Bit" perpetual trophy ** to highest placing team Overall
- "The George Memorial" perpetual trophy ** to highest scoring Show Jumping Team
- "Golden Pitchfork" perpetual award ** to team scoring least Horse Management points
- "The David Kitts Memorial" perpetual trophy ** to individual with best riding score (equitation and clean rounds)

CHAPERONE FORM

To be completed by the chaperone and turned in with the rally entry for USPC members below the age of majority.

Chaperone duties shall include:

- 1. The primary function of the "Official Team Chaperone" is to ensure that there is a contact person for every USPC member below the age of majority, on the grounds for the duration of the competition.
- 2. While multiple Chaperone Forms may be turned in for a single team, only one person will be designated the Official Team Chaperone. If the Official Team Chaperone must leave the grounds during the competition, they must delegate the team chaperone duties to another responsible adult, making it clear that they are to respond to rally officials and any team members in your absence.
- 3. Be present and available to rally officials and all team members for the duration of the competition.
- 4. Being in contact with parents/guardians for all team members during competition hours.
- 5. Being in contact with all team members and their parents/ guardians outside of competition hours.
- 6. Have copy of and be familiar with the current discipline rulebook and the current Horse Management Handbook. Rulebooks available for download from www.ponyclub.org.
- 7. Be aware that USPC members are required to wear a current, up-to-date USPC medical card/bracelet on their arm at all USPC activities.
- Be familiar with the effects of heat and humidity and the potential risk for heat related illness.
 Take an active role in helping to keep all team members well hydrated and take every opportunity to encourage water breaks.
- 9. Uphold USPC Substances and Weapons Policy which prohibits the inappropriate or illegal use of any substance, including but not limited to drugs or alcohol, by anyone participating in any manner. Weapons of any kind are forbidden. Refer to About/About the Organization/By-Laws, Policies and Resolutions on www.ponyclub.org for the full policy statement.
- 10. Remember that administration of medications is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian.

COACHING GUIDELINES FORM

Each coach should have a copy and a signed copy submitted with entries. Photocopy as necessary.

Penalties for violating these coaching guidelines will be assessed by the discipline ground jury and/or overall ground jury under the rules governing unauthorized assistance. Any coach not adhering to the rules set forth below may be removed from their position for the duration of the phase and/or competition.

Coaches are for required for Show Jumping rallies and Championships. There may be one or more coaches per team; the organizer or ring steward may limit the number of coaches in a warm-up area at any given time.

Agreement

By signing this form, you:

- Agree to be familiar with and observe all USPC By-Laws, Policies and competition rules.
- Agree to be governed by Horse Management guidelines as expected of competitors, including appropriate attire, footwear and conduct.
- Agree to adhere to the USPC Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Policies in all your actions and decisions.
- Agree to conduct yourself in a fair and courteous manner.

Coaches Must

- Check in as requested and attend any official coaches' briefings.
- Be familiar with, understand and comply with the current USPC discipline and Horse Management rules.
- Be aware of the welfare of mount and rider.
- Wear identification as provided by the organizer/secretary during the competition times.
- Follow all discipline coach parameters outlined in the discipline rulebook.
- Assist competitors in learning and understanding all rules pertinent to the competition.
- Help any Pony Club competitor who asks for help or who is present without a coach.

Coaches Must Not

- Enter the barn except during authorized visiting times.
- Interfere with the immediate care of the mount under penalty of elimination of the competitor.
- Coach in a manner that interferes with the warm-up of other competitors.

- Be the organizer, and member of the organizing committee or any other official of the competition.
- Be a team chaperone.
- Be an RS at a regional competition.

Coaching Duties

- Warming-up competitors for competition in the designated warm-up areas only.
- In addition, a coach may lead a competitor's mount into the arena area.
- Coaches may observe but not participate in (unless requested), soundness checks or horse inspections.
- Meet with the team to discuss ride times, planning and how to best utilize the coach within the team.

Communications between Coaches and Competitors

- Coaches may communicate with the competitors during the official briefing and any subsequent briefings as required by the organizer and in the warm-up area prior to and following the competitor's ride.
- Coaches may accompany competitors during their ride, arena inspection, course walks or any other subsequent times competition areas are open for warm-up, during which they may give advice and coach.

Competitors who wish to Coach while Competing

Championships competitors who are 18 years of age as of January 1 of the competition year may coach other members recognizing that:

- No scheduling changes will be made to accommodate coaching /riding times.
- Care of mount and other competitor responsibilities take precedence over coaching.
