General Rally Information

Eligibility	All Pony Club members in good standing may participate. Club, GLR and national dues paid in full.
rugionity	The DC/CA is responsible for determining eligibility and safety of members in his/her club.
Teams	Consists of 3 or 4 riding members and a Stable Manager. Mixed rating teams are recommended. Each team must have a captain.
	Each team is required to have a Stable Manager primarily for safety due to tying to the trailers. Exceptions for
	older/more experienced teams may be petitioned to the Organizer. Stable Managers are required for teams at
	Championships.
	Each team must have an official chaperone.
	Teams can have a coach (can be shared by more than one team), a coach is NOT required.
	If your club does not have enough participants to form a full team, you may contact other clubs, or inform the Rally
	Secretary, who may be able to help you form a Scramble team.
Mounts	 All mounts (mares and geldings only) must be 5 years of age or older at the time of the rally unless clubber is a C rating or above rider.
	 Mounts must be able to be tied or stand in a trailer all day and be appropriate for member to manage on the ground and under saddle.

Rules	Horse Management for the rally will be run in accordance with the USPC Horse Management Handbook and
	Competition Rules for 2023 and any addenda.
	The Eventing Rally will be run in accordance with the USPC Eventing Rulebook 2023 and all addenda.
Stabling	• Limited Stabling available at Revel Run \$120 per night. First come first serve according to <u>Blue Horse Entries</u> .
	 Another Stabling option is available for Pony Clubbers only at Brookside in South Lyon for \$40 per night. Be prepared to use trailers for tack at the rally. Typical tack area at one-day rally could be a trailer dressing room or
	 Be prepared to use trailers for tack at the rally. Typical tack area at one-day rally could be a trailer dressing room or empty horse area of trailer, bed of pickup truck or canopy area.
	 Feed rooms are not required because it is not an overnight, on grounds rally trailer wherever you are stabled.
Medical	Each competitor (including Stable Managers) <i>must</i> wear a Medical Armband containing an original, signed USPC or
	USEA Medical Card OR
Armband	Medical Wrist Band in accordance to USPC policy 0128, effective 1/1/15.
OR Wrist Band	It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure the Medical Armband/Wrist Band contains current and correct
	information.
Lodging	Chelsea, Dexter, and Ann Arbor have plenty of options as well as Air B&B can also be searched in the local area.
Horse Changes	 Any horse or level changes must go through the secretary; \$20 rally fee for changes will apply.
Cancellations/	Doctor or Vet note required for refund.
Refunds	
Meals	Meals are not included in the entry fee. Parents and Chaperones are encouraged to pack coolers for team tack rooms.
Farrier/Vet	Will be on call during the rally. All services are to be paid at the time of service; payment is the responsibility of the
	horse/pony owner. Phone numbers will be available in the horse trial secretary tent.
Volunteers	Each team must provide 1 volunteer for each competitor. Horse knowledge is not required to volunteer. Volunteers
3- 	may be minors. Typically, most over the age of 12 can be helpful. Use good judgement when volunteering younger
	people and note that the person is a minor on the entry as they need to function independently and in a timely
	manner.

5:30 pm	Rally Closing. Parents may assist. Departure (all horse and competitor departures must check out with HM or RIC).

Upon arrival, follow the direction of the volunteer coordinating the pony club designated parking. Be sure to let the volunteer know if you have additional team members coming so an additional trailer spot is saved.

Notes regarding schedule:

- Chaperone and captain can check entire team in.
- Times should be regarded as approximate. Packets handed out at rally check-in will specify the final schedule.
- All riders should bring helmets to the initial briefing for inspection.
- Turnbacks for each rider/horse should occur within one hour of the final ride of the day on Sunday.
- Competitors must be on grounds for the entire time their teammates are competing (including horse management); someone else may take the horse(s) home when they are finished and released for the day and with the approval of the CHMJ.

Championships qualifiers are required to be a certain age for levels, please refer to Gold Book for all qualification details, this chart is provided for your reference.

You may compete in any division regardless of age if you are the appropriate certification if you are NOT a championships qualifier.

- This rally should not be the first competition at a higher level. Competitors should enter a level in which they are safe, competent and comfortable (as per qualifying/non-qualifying requirements).
- Competitor's horse management expectations are judged at their HM rating as of the rally entry closing date.
- Competitors may enter two horses for the rally with approval of DC and Organizer. Competitors will be required to have only one turnout inspection.
- Dressage Tests will follow Horse Trial Entry be prepared to perform 2022 USEF Test A for all levels at this competition and 2022 USEF Test B at Championships.

Facility Rules

Dogs MUST be leashed. Clean up after your own pet. No pets near the arenas or horses at the trailers for the safety of the competitors.

Warm up and longeing in designated areas only. Longeing according to USPC HM handbook. (Must sign up with CHMJ at the rally tent)

CLUB/CENTER CHECKLIST

Please double-check all forms to ensure they are completed correctly and all forms are signed before entering the Wufoo site. All entries and forms must be printed, signed and uploaded to Wufoo and entries do not save so enter the site when you have all your documents. All entries and payments must be made prior to the closing date to avoid late fee of \$20/competitor. Wufoo will accept debit, credit card or Paypal. Revel Run Horse Trial entries should be submitted as soon as possible after the opening date in order to ensure entry is accepted.

Per Team/Individual:

- 1. Review all Riders and Riding Levels for Eventing Rally with your DC prior to signing team up.
- 2. One (1) Club Designee will enter all team members with Team Name into Wufoo. For Scramble teams enter Scramble for Team Name.

Scale of 1-5 is from least to most experience/skill.

AHMJ*	All Day	3-5	3-5	Supervise, evaluate and assist riders in the barns; AHMJs must work well with each other and competitors; must be willing to work with horses and be physically able to work the entire rally; Review HM rules prior to rally and have prior HM training; Appropriate dress; compensated with food.
Warm Up Arena Steward*	Half day	2	3	Assist Riders into the ring; monitor schedule and rider order to "push" them into the gate keeper at the ring (in order, in correct ring); watch schedule and rider order to answer rider schedule questions; Observe for safe warm up behavior to report to HM or TD if problems.
Gate Keeper*	Half day	2	3	Monitor order of go and ride schedule to keep riders in order and on time; may communicate with judges if need to go out of order; work with ring steward to keep riders in order.
Scoring assistant	All day,	3	5	Receive, sort and input all scores into scoring database; Assist scoring chief in troubleshooting and producing final scores; must be detail-oriented.
XC Jump Judges*	Sunday	1	2-3	XC Jump will be assigned. Jump judge briefing at HT tent. Limited experience needed. Will be required to remain at jump until assignment completed. It is recommended to bring chair/sunscreen/water. All day jump judges will be provided lunch.
Ring Crew*	Sporadically throughout rally	1	1	Must be physically able to lift awkward or heavy equipment to facilitate grounds crew in changing of rings.
Score Runner	Throughout day	1	1	Pick up score sheets from judges to bring to scoring; must be tactful in moving through show grounds and approaching judges.

Part 1 – RULES FOR RALLIES

A10: Emergency Contact Form

for USPC Members Above the Age of Majority

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The age of majority is the threshold of adulthood in law. As USPC Members above the age of majority are adults in the eyes of the law and therefore responsible for themselves, USPC does not require a "Chaperone" for these members at Competitions. USPC does require that members above the age of majority submit emergency contact information for each competition. Age of majority vary per state.
