Regional Officers' Reports

• 2022 RS Report - Wendy Willford

- See Wendy's power point for details.
- Of note: Adult members must complete SafeSport & background check requirements or they will not be allowed to renew their membership for 2023.
- Expect monthly 1 hour leadership calls to keep leaders informed and begin planning for the 2025 annual meeting, topics will be relevant to upcoming activities/events.

- o Need to fundraise this year. We need to build back up our reserve.

Treasurer's Report and 2022 BvA – Melynda Ziehm

- The slush in our banking account has been depleted and we will probably drop below our limit of \$20,000.
- We are now part of Filer Credit Union and have closed the account with FifthThird to avoid fees.
- Need to depreciate the Jump 4 Joy Show Jumping standards/poles over the next 5
 years since they are considered assets.
- Expecting a loss for 2022 of ~\$4,000. We are about \$1400 higher than our originally budgeted loss.
- We have some outstanding regional dues.
 - We do not expect Dream Big to renew and will be writing any of their expenses off.
- Begin using Amazon Smile and donate to the region at the same time. The region is now set up to be a beneficiary.
- Melynda to offer training for upcoming new treasurers.
- o Kroger Card fundraising can be set up to be sent to the Great Lakes Region.

• 2022 HMO Report – Alysia Apley

- Becky Smith was the chief for Eventing Rally, 1 day trailer rally and went pretty smoothly. Vet box and briefing was done the night before and recommend that happen again.
- o Presentation for AHMJ's in June.
- Stefanie Infante was the chief for Mega Rally, very fair and safe. Would love to come back and has some ideas for our region. Albion was a great facility. Had the first checks and required equipment done the night before. First checks were an issue for many members so clubs should focus on this prior to rally season next year.

• <u>2022 RIC Report</u> – Kerry McKinley

- Orange Block:
 - Great reference tools on Kerry's report, please view those directly to make your job as a club/center leader easier.
 - Also includes references for hosting testings related specifically to our region.
- o Blue Block:
 - Review of the year, very difficult to find a national examiner available for April
 - Very beneficial to have a testing prep just prior to a national testing.
 - Revel Run was fantastic to work with, highly recommend we utilize them for future activities.

 - We may be able to share power points from the UL clinics on our website.

• 2022 RTC Report – Brenda Staat-Tomlinson

- Earlier this year we redesigned the website to make it easier for leaders to coordinate testings, but this does not seem to be utilized fully.
- Had 11 certification testings hosted, but only 5 were communicated as requested to Brenda.


- Eventing Rally GLR EB with MHIIPC (Mary Orlando / Melynda Ziehm)
